Position: Discipleship Director

Reports to: Camp Executive Director

Job Purpose: Recruit, mentor and disciple teens creating lasting relationships through working at camp in supporting roles. Ultimately, to grow thriving committed Christians who will be able to fill leadership roles at camp and abroad. Showing love and forgiveness.

Requirements:

- ❖ A growing personal relationship with Jesus Christ
- Organizational and leadership skills, delegation abilities
- Experience in camp leadership
- Patience and high communication skills
- ❖ A passion for sharing the gospel clearly in everyday activities
- Must be UIM missionary, responsible for raising personal support. Please see below for details as to how to apply to UIM.

Responsibilities: Overseeing Work Crew (TNT) staff

- Recruiting teens to fill positions
 - o Identifying potential teen campers for work crew positions
 - Assisting the teens with the application process
 - Assist the Director in screening applicants
- Help plan and organize the Work Crew events
 - Work Crew Spring Retreat
 - Summer applicants
 - Work Crew end of summer staff hike
 - Work Crew fall retreat

- Assist the director with work crew staff training
 - Staff Orientation and Training for work crew areas
 - Work Crew Staff Issues
 - Be proactive in promoting good staff relations and communication in an effort to ward off any issues. In case of staff issues arising, work through the issues with all parties. Any unresolved issues contact Camp Director
- Assist in developing camp Work Crew budget
 - Supervise budget spending.
- Assist Program Director with campers.
 - Work crew staff will have some responsibilities to help the counselors in working with the campers
 - Games
 - Chapel
 - Activities
 - During free time

Discipleship

- Conduct daily bible study with work crew
- Attend chapel with work crew whenever possible
- Follow up with work crew throughout the year
 - Focus on continuing biblical teaching
- Holding work crew accountable to code of conduct and camp rules.
 - Using conflicts to teach biblical truths.

UIM Missionary Application Process: There are five stages to the process:

The Applicant (pre-acceptance, application)

The Candidate (pre-acceptance, interviews)

The Missionary Appointee (pre-field assignment, support raising)

The Field Missionary (two-year, first term)

The Senior Missionary (long-term)

Be sure that you are in agreement with the Statement of Faith and Position Statements.

The process of becoming a missionary with UIM International involves a substantial investment of resources like time and finances.
